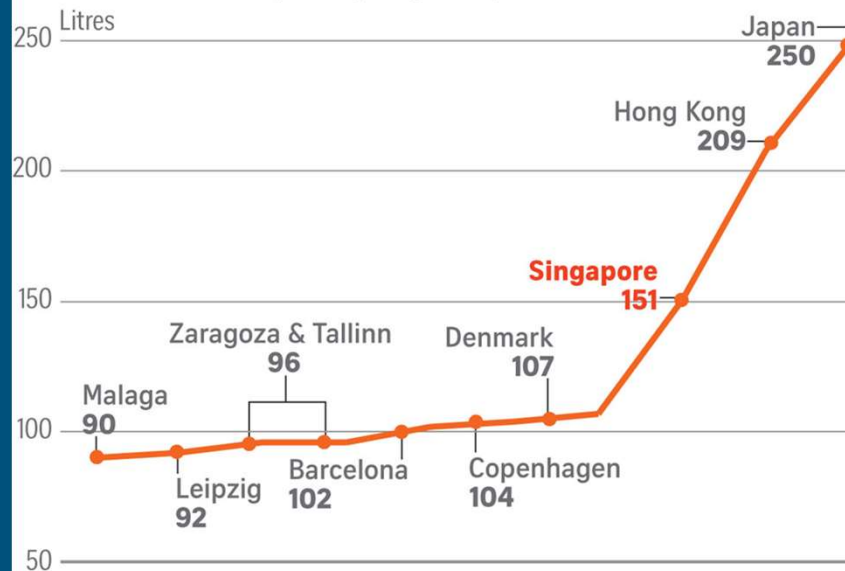

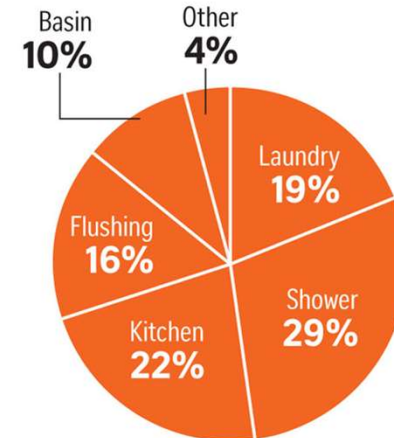
Where does all the water go?

On average, every Singapore resident uses about 151 litres of water per day, a figure some may find surprising. The Sunday Times looks at what the water is used for at home, and how we compare with other countries and cities.

Water Saved With Eco Shower (per day)

- Usual Shower Water Usage

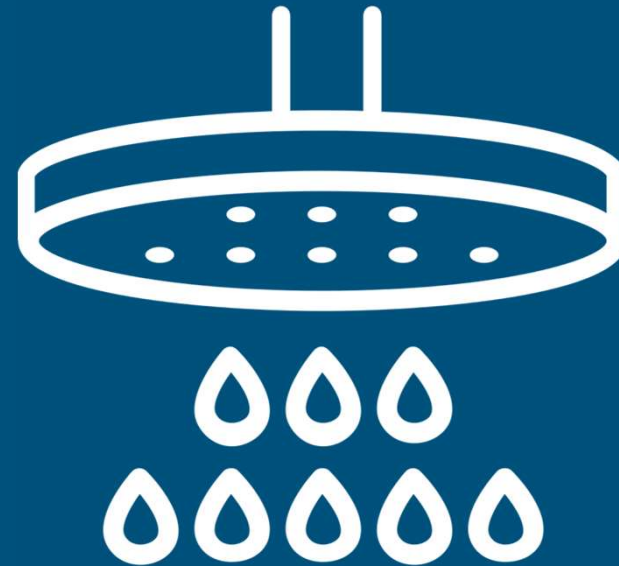
151 litres X 29 % = 43.79 litres

- Water Saved By Limiting

43.79 - 40 = 3.79 litres

- Water saved by Singaporeans

3.79 litres X 5.6 million = 21,224,000 litres
